Family Law

- MARRIAGE**
 - Ceremonial Marriage Requirements
 - Voluntary Consent
 - Can't be married to someone else
 - Can't be too closely related
 - Can't be same gender
 - Doesn't matter if another state recognizes
 - Age
 - 18 or older or
 - 16 or 17 w/ written consent of parent/guardian OR w/ court approval if no parent/guardian
 - Under 16 only w/ court approval if unmarried & pregnant, or in settlement of a suit for seduction or paternity
 - Maritally competent
 - Cannot remarry w/in 6 months of last divorce
 - But if parties live together after the 6 mo. Period, the marriage becomes common law & cannot be annulled
 - Marriage License
 - Valid for 30 days
 - Get fee reduce if complete pre marriage counsel
 - Ceremony
 - Conduct by judge & religious leader
 - Need 2 adult, competent witnesses
 - Officiant & witnesses must sign certificate
 - Common Law Marriage
 - Competent & 6 Elements
 - Permanent
 - Exclusive
 - Actual intent to be Married
 - Cohabitation
 - Holding Out to Public as H & W
 - Must show by CLEAR & CONVINCING EVIDENCE
 - Must be terminated same as ceremonial marriage
- ANNULMENT**
 - Void Marriage
 - Fail to meet essential requirements, invalid (utter nullity)
 - Can be attacked by a party or collaterally by 3rd party
 - Can be attacked even after death of one of parties
 - NOT TEMPORARY ALIENATION
 - Examples: bigamy, incest, same sex
 - Voidable Marriage
 - Event of condition affecting adequacy of consent
